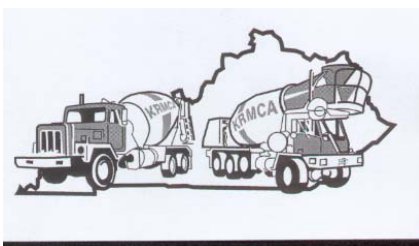

Even in a down economy, he has been successful by converting asphalt parking lots to concrete. Here is a direct quote from Len, *“Most of our recent marketing efforts are put into promoting concrete parking lots and concrete paving. There are tremendous opportunities here. With the right equipment and a trained workforce we are now efficient enough to price competitively with asphalt on initial cost. Ready-mix producers have always dreamed of this. The marketing challenge is to educate owners, architects, engineers and the public on the life-cycle savings, reduced lighting costs, and reduced environmental impact.”* Len adheres to his own preaching and uses a 3-D profiler and laser screed in parking lot installations which helps him to be extremely competitive.

Green and sustainable design practices are the future of construction for contractors, designers and owners. While asphalt has long been the pavement of choice, recent innovations in the oil refining process has left smaller amounts of a barrel available to make asphalt. This is keeping the pricing high and creating shortages in some areas.
