

## **STORM WATER PHASE II Workshop in Lexington - September 20-21**

US EPA is partnering with several Kentucky agencies and organizations to host a 2-day Stormwater Phase II Workshop in Lexington ("Horse Capital of the World") Kentucky during September 20-21. The workshop will focus on selected minimum measures required by the Phase II NPDES permitting program-Public Education and Outreach, Public Participation and Involvement, Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE), Pollution Prevention/Good Housekeeping, and Post-Construction Runoff Controls.

This event will bring together the experience and support of local municipal stormwater managers and staff from the U.S. EPA Office of Wastewater Management in Washington DC.

There is a \$25 fee for attending this workshop, to cover refreshments only. Registration is required.

What will be covered?

Day 1: Learn how to develop and conduct an effective public information and education program, and what's required by EPA for your construction management and post-construction runoff control program. You'll learn the six basic outreach steps, program requirements for overseeing construction site runoff controls, and how to develop and implement the required controls on post-construction stormwater impacts.

Day 2: Learn what it takes to develop and implement an IDDE program. You'll hear about lab and field assessment protocols, find out what others have already done, and learn how to conduct a survey of discharges. In addition, you will find out how to reduce pollutant runoff from municipal operations, including road maintenance and management.

Who should attend?

The workshop is open to state, regional, and local officials and public agency program managers responsible for developing Stormwater Phase II Programs. Registration priority will be given to state and local stormwater program managers.
